Guidance for speakers at AIA & YMB events regarding copyright issues

Most of the AIA's public events now and for the foreseeable future are likely to be recorded and made available via the internet. This brings more closely into focus issues regarding the use of copyright material in the various talks which will be given.

In response to requests for guidance on this issue, our requirements for talks which are to be presented at AIA & YMB events are as follows:

Speakers must ensure that:

1. The source of all images used in their presentations is acknowledged
2. They are permitted to use these images in the way that they have done
3. Sources of quotations are acknowledged

Acknowledgements could be on the page where they are used or in a list shown at the end of the talk.

Speakers must indicate to the organiser of the event:

1. That they believe they have correctly done all the above
2. That they are willing for their presentation to be recorded and published by us

For example, a list of acknowledgements might appear like this:
